SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

First-aid measures after inhalation : If inhaled and if breathing is difficult, remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If you feel unwell, seek medical advice.

First-aid measures after skin contact : Wash skin thoroughly with mild soap and water. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse. Get medical attention if symptoms occur. After contact with the molten product, cool rapidly with cold water. Do not tear off solidified product from the skin.

First-aid measures after eye contact : Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Continue rinsing. Get medical advice/attention if you feel unwell. After contact with molten product, cool skin area rapidly with cold water. Contact ophthalmologist immediately.

First-aid measures after ingestion : Ingestion is not considered a potential route of exposure. If accidentally swallowed obtain immediate medical attention.

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Symptoms/effects after inhalation : Dust of the product, if present, may cause respiratory irritation after excessive inhalation exposure.

Symptoms/effects after skin contact : Not expected to present a significant skin hazard under anticipated conditions of normal use. Risk of thermal burns on contact with molten product.

Symptoms/effects after eye contact : Dust contact with the eyes can lead to mechanical irritation. Risk of thermal burns on contact with molten product.

Symptoms/effects after ingestion : Not expected to present a significant hazard under anticipated conditions of normal use.

4.3. Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Treat symptomatically.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1. Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media : Dry powder. Carbon dioxide. Water spray. Foam. Use extinguishing agent suitable for surrounding fire.

Unsuitable extinguishing media : Do not use a heavy water stream.

5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Fire hazard : Presents no particular fire or explosion hazard. Burning produces stinking and toxic fumes. In case of fire and/or explosion do not breathe fumes.

5.3. Advice for firefighters

Firefighting instructions : Evacuate the danger area. Move containers from fire area if it can be done without personal risk. Use water spray or fog for cooling exposed containers. Fight fire from safe distance and protected location. Use extinguishing media appropriate for surrounding fire. Prevent fire fighting water from entering the environment.

Protection during firefighting : Wear a self contained breathing apparatus. Wear fire/flame resistant/retardant clothing. Do not attempt to take action without suitable protective equipment.
